## definition and history

definition

The study of psychological and behavioral dysfunctionoccurring in mental illness or social disorganization.

#### historical considerations

#### roots in ancient times

- -earliest record of mental disorder is dated **6th century BCE**.
- **-Egyptian papyri** with the earliest diseases and behavioural disorders treatments.
- -The **Greek, Roman & Hebrew writings** shed light on differing illnesses.
- -With the development of early **medical concepts**, views on mental illness began to change.

## Middle Ages

- -during the middle ages, a culmination of views approached (scientific, philosophical & religious)
- --Renaissance, scientific questioning reemerged in the form of humanism movement.

#### world war

- during **world war** major changes were noted in the field of psychology.
- -these changes can be traced thru **three distinctive phases**:
- -- Magico religious models
- --Medical models
- --Psycho-social models

## Magico-religious model

AKA Mistico-religious model

# demonology

- -Belief in the **Supernatural Forces** controlled human behaviour.
- -A time when mental illness was equated to Supernatural causes\*\*
- -treating them in accordance to the dominant spiritual thinking that existed (exorcism, penance)
- -Consisted of **superstitious beliefs & horrific rituals** (confinement, beating, torture, trephination, bloodletting)

#### Psycho-social model

- -A psychological and socio-cultural point of view
- -Paracelsus (1490-1541), a swiss doc was an early critique of beliefs of **possession**.
- -16th century **asylums**, places of refuge solely for the mentally ill grew in number
- -Mentally ill were excluded from mainstream society

- -Most rituals practised are more inclined t cause harm than help .

- -This model explains disorders as a **bodily disease** (somatogenic approach)
- -Hippocrates was probably considered the first to link disorders to bodily dysfunctions (Humoral theory)
