Accusative Case	Noun that is the direct object of a sentence

First Conjugation (-a stem verbs)				
	Singular		Personal Endings	
First Person	laud <b>o</b>	I praise	-O	
Second Person	lauda <b>s</b>	you praise	-s	
Third Person	lauda <b>t</b>	he, she, it praises	-t	

	Plural		
First Person	lauda- <b>mus</b>	we praise	-mus
Second Person	lauda <b>tis</b>	you praise	-tis
Third Person	lauda <b>nt</b>	they praise	-nt
Can be translated as "I praise", "I am praising" or "I do praise".			

Second Conjugation (-e stem verbs)			
	Singular		Personal Endings
First Person	vide <b>o</b>	I see	-0
Second Person	vide <b>s</b>	you see	-S
Third Person	videt	he, she, it sees	-t
	Plural		
First Person	vide <b>mus</b>	we see	-mus
Second Person	vide <b>tis</b>	you see	-tis
Third Person**	vide <b>nt</b>	they see	-nt
Can be translated as "I see", "I am seeing" or "I do see".
