Academic Policies

Academic Eligibility	Helps undergraduates students stay on track for degree completion at the University of Arizona and is calculated for students at the end of each fall and spring semester.
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Academic Policies (cont)

Academic Integrity	Lists students responsibilities and expectations to the school, prohibiting practices such as plagiarism.
Grade Appeals	The procedure by which a student may appeal a grade they believe may have been unfairly graded.
Nondiscrimination and Anti-Harassment Policy	Prohibits discrimination, including harassment and retaliation, based on a protected classification, including race, color, religion, sex (including pregnancy), national origin, age, disability, veteran status, sexual orientation, gender identity, or genetic information. Followed by staff, students, and programs.
Release of Student Information	Allows the institution to not be required to permit students to review information about other students, financial records of parents, and confidential letters of recommendation if they waived their right of access.

Academic Policies (cont)

Religious Accommodation	Requires faculty to reasonably accommodate the religious needs, observances, and practices of their employees and students upon request.
Student Code of Conduct	Set standards of behavior to create a safe, healthy, and responsible environment that allows UA students, faculty, and staff

Student Union Memorial Center	Houses dining locations, meeting spaces, and campus resources for students and faculty.	On the UA Mall, next to Old Main in the center of the campus
The Mall	The long stretch of grass in the center of campus.	From Old Main to North Campbell Avenue
Alumni Plaza	This plaza was officially dedicated to the Wildcat family — all who have been or will be associated with the UA — at the 2004 Homecoming celebration.	Located in front of the Administration Building next to the Mall

Fraternity & Sorority Programs	This office houses the many fraternities and sororities at the University of Arizona. They are divided within three councils: the Interfraternity Council, the Panhellenic Council, and the United Sorority & Fraternity Council. There are organizations for everyone within FSP.

The Associated Students of the University of Arizona (ASUA)	ASUA is the student government on the University of Arizona campus that is comprised of students who are willing to go above and beyond and serve their school and peers.
The Wildcat Events Board (WEB)	A student-run programming board within ASUA that creates opportunities for students to engage with each other and participate in fun, social, and educational events.
FORCE Feminists Organized to Resist, Create, and Empower	FORCE creates feminist community on the UA campus and also offers educational outreach programs.
Handshake	A free online career hub that gives all students access to job and internship postings, career fair and employer events, employer pages with peer reviews, and more. A great way to find an on-campus job.
