

### Simple Past

Used to talk about something that started in the past and finished in the past.  
Used to describe a sequence of events in past.

We use time expressions to talk about the date or time when the action happened.

### Past Time Expressions

Last week	One week ago
Last weekend	Two months ago
Last month	Three years ago
Last year	Yesterday

### Structure

Affirm-ative	Subject + Verb + 'ed' + complement
Negative	Subject + Aux <b>didn't</b> + verb + complement
Question	Aux <b>did</b> + Subject + verb + complement

### Past Continuous

To speak about an activity that happened at a specific time.  
To indicate that an action in the past was interrupted. you use also past simple in the same sentence.

### structure

Affirm-ative	Subject + To Be <b>(was/were)</b> + verb+ing + complement
Negative	Subject + To Be <b>(wasn't/weren't)</b> + verb+ing + complement
Question	To be <b>(was/were)</b> + subject + verb+ing + complement ?

### Past Continuous and Past Simple

When he was crossing the street, the lights turned red.

### Past Perfect Tense

To talk actions completed before other events in the past.  
It is just used when talking about two actions.

### structure

Affirm-ative	Pron + <b>had</b> + participle verb + complement
Negative	Pron + had not + participle verb + complement
Question	had + pron + participle verb + complement ?

### Use of Adverb

<b>Just</b>	finished
<b>Really</b>	Tried
<b>Already</b>	Eaten
<b>Ever</b>	gone
