

Sessions

Start a new session	<code>tmux</code>
Attach to default session	<code>tmux a</code>
List existing sessions	<code>tmux ls</code>
Detach current client	<code>^b d</code>
Detach other clients	<code>^b D</code>
Rename the current session	<code>^b \$</code>

Note: `^b` is the default bind-key **ctrl+b**.

Windows (tabs)

Create a new window	<code>^b c</code>
Next window	<code>^b n</code>
Previous window	<code>^b p</code>
Select a window interactively	<code>^b w</code>
Rename the current window	<code>^b ,</code>
Kill the current window	<code>^b &</code>

In the status bar (bottom) are the number/name of windows.

Tmux prompt commands

Enter a tmux command prompt	<code>^b :</code>
Toggle broadcast to all panes	<code>setw synchronize-panes</code>

Panes (vertical/horizontal splits)

Split current pane vertically	<code>^b %</code>
Split current pane horizontally	<code>^b "</code>
Navigate around panes	<code>^b <arrow keys></code>
Resize the current pane	<code>^b ^<arrow keys></code>
Swap pane location	<code>^b ^o</code>
Send the current pane to a new window	<code>^b !</code>
Toggle zoom current pane	<code>^b z</code>
Arrange panes in a tiled layout	<code>^b alt+5</code>
Arrange to a next preset layout	<code>^b <space></code>
Kill current pane	<code>^b x</code>

There are many other key-bindings for resizing panes that are worth learning, but out of scope for a basic cheatsheet.

Config file for customization

```
# Shortcut to 'synchronize panes' with '^b ='  
bind = set -g synchr oni ze- panes  
# Enable mouse support  
set -g mouse on
```

Save this configuration in the `~/.tmux.conf` file.
