Open Angles: can cause glaucoma or mess up the refraction. Check with provider for younger patients.

Follow Up Schedule

Spectacle/CL Rx RTC in 1 year

Glaucoma (POAG) RTC q 3 months (4x a year)

1. Full 2. 3m IOP **3.** 3m 4. Exam OCT/VF/ 3m Gonio IOP

AMD RTC q 6 months

2. 6m MAC/OCT/DFE 1. CEE

Chorodial Nevus

1. CEE 2. 3m f/u *if stable can go (Fundus) (DFE/Fback to 1x a UNDUS) if vear at CEE new

- Can watch yearly or 6m
