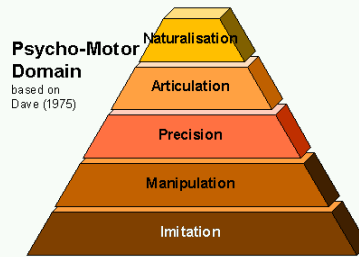

### Psychomotor Categories

Category	Description	Key Words	Examples
<b>Imitation</b>	Observing and patterning behavior after someone else. Performance may be of low quality.	copy, follow, mimic, repeat, replicate, reproduce, trace	Copying a work of art. Performing a skill while observing a demonstrator.
<b>Manipulation</b>	Being able to perform certain actions by memory or following instructions.	act, build, execute, perform	Being able to perform a skill on one's own after taking lessons or reading about it. Follows instructions to build a model.
<b>Precision</b>	Refining, becoming more exact. Performing a skill within a high degree of precision	calibrate, demonstrate, master, perfectionism	Working and reworking something, so it will be "just right." Perform a skill or task without assistance. Demonstrate a task to a beginner.
<b>Articulation</b>	Coordinating and adapting a series of actions to achieve harmony and internal consistency.	adapt, constructs, combine, creates, customize, modifies, formulate	Combining a series of skills to produce a video that involves music, drama, color, sound, etc. Combining a series of skills or activities to meet a novel requirement.
<b>Naturalization</b>	Mastering a high level performance until it become second-nature or natural, without needing to think much about it.	create, design, develop, invent, manage, naturally	Maneuvers a car into a tight parallel parking spot. Operates a computer quickly and accurately. Displays competence while playing the piano. Michael Jordan playing basketball or Nancy Lopez hitting a golf ball.
