What does the Law of Confidence protect?

Information/ Ideas which are not in the public domain.

What is Confidential Information?

Information that is private and not of public knowledge

The information/ideas can be either commercial or non-commercial

Vestwin Trading Pte Ltd v Obegi [2006] SLR 573

Elements of breach of confidence

- 1. The information must have the quality of confidence (it must be confidential)
- 2. Information must be disclosed in circumstances importing an obligation of confidence (there must be a relationship of confidentiality)
- 3. There must unauthorized use of the information to the detriment of the party who originally disclosed it (the disclosure must be in breach of confidence)

Coco v Clark.

Elements of confidence

All 3 elements must be fulfilled:

- 1. Quality
- 2. Obligation/relationship
- 3. Unauthorized use resulting in detriment

All this must be established before an action for breach of confidence can succeed.
