

## Towards Independence

<b>Bond</b>	money that is used to cover any damage or cleaning costs if the rented premises are left in bad condition
<b>Community Services</b>	services largely funded from within the community to provide something that is desirable but not profit making
<b>Insurance</b>	the payment of an amount of money that covers a person or property in an event of loss, damage or accident
<b>Lease</b>	a legal document that defines the conditions of the rental agreement between the tenant and the landlord
<b>Payday Loan</b>	a relatively small amount of money lent at a high rate of interest on the agreement that it will be repaid when the borrower receives their next paycheck
<b>Premium</b>	an amount to be paid for an insurance policy
<b>Sharing Economy</b>	involves people sharing their possessions for payment

## Law in Action

<b>Actus Rea</b>	the guilty action, you have committed a crime
<b>Actus Reus</b>	the prosecution has to prove they committed the act, the act occurred, done by the person they say it was done by, and that it was voluntary
<b>Civil Law</b>	deals with non-criminal matters involving disputes between individuals and organisations conciliation
<b>Criminal Law</b>	law involving cases where the government has declared some action to be illegal
<b>Defendant</b>	the party in a criminal or civil trial against whom an action has been brought
<b>Legal Capacity</b>	the ability of a person to do something
<b>Mens Rea</b>	that the accused had the intention of committing the wrongful act
<b>Negligence</b>	the failure to exercise proper care, which could result in another person being injured or suffering a risk
<b>Plaintiff</b>	the party who takes the case to court in a civil case

## Law in Action (cont)

<b>Sue</b>	to bring a civil action against another person for causing damage or inj
<b>Trial</b>	a process to determine whether someone committed a criminal act or caused another person a loss
<b>Victim</b>	a person who is injured or killed by another person in an act of violence

## Example Questions

<b>three major purchases</b>	mobile phone, car, property
<b>recurring costs of a car</b>	insurance, registration, servicing, fuel
<b>consideration when buying a car</b>	lifestyle, time, fuel economy, cost of insurances, time to pay the loan, size of the car
<b>types of insurances</b>	household, motor vehicle, personal, pet, marine + workers compensation
<b>considerations when leaving home</b>	planning + preparation, building independence, adapting to change
<b>benefits of community involvement</b>	higher levels of satisfaction, sense of belong + purpose, allow for desire service without payment

Distinguish	Recognise or note/indicate as being distinct or different from; to note differences between.			
Evaluate	Make a judgement based on criteria; determine the value of.

Identify	Recognise and name.

Investigate	Plan, inquire into and draw conclusions about.			
Justify	Support an argument or conclusion.			
Outline	Sketch in general terms; indicate the main features of.			
Predict	Suggest what may happen based on available information.			
Propose	Put forward (for example a point of view, idea, argument, suggestion) for consideration or action.			
Recall	Present remembered ideas, facts or experiences.
