

Introduction

This guide is designed to help you guide students through the process of applying for their degree and describes what steps need to be taken to help students to finish.

Degree Conferral Process

- student completes the degree conferral application ↓
- degree checklist is generated based on application ↓
- checklist is provided electronically to departments ↓
- departments distribute to advisors ↓
- advisor reviews with student in final term ↓
- advisor signs form and provides completion information ↓
- associate dean certifies the form ↓
- SRRS confers after final confirmation/completion ✓

Requirements

Students with less than 90 earned credit hours will not have the ability to apply for degree conferral. Undergraduate students with less than 90 credits who attempt to apply will receive an on screen message that s/he is not eligible. The student will need to wait until they have **earned 90 credit hours**.

Graduate students can apply for degree conferral at any time; there are no minimum credit hours. However, discretion should be used when applying to avoid applying too early.

Important Dates and Deadlines

Graduation Term	Application Deadline
Fall 2023	December 1
Winter 2024	January 1
Spring 2024	May 1
Summer 2024	August 1

Any student who wishes to have their name appear in the commencement program must apply by march 1st regardless of their conferral term.

Quick Tips!

- ! Be on the lookout for inconsistencies in the audit such as INC or LGs.
- ! Be sure all course exception/substitution forms have been submitted (and applied to the audit!)
- ! Students should submit degree conferral apps 1-2 semesters prior to expected completion.

Did you know?



Students can participate in the 2024 commencement ceremony if their degree requirements will be complete within the academic year: Fall 2023, Winter 2024, Spring 2024, Summer 2024.

Vocabulary

Commencement

Commencement is the ceremony that celebrates the completion of a degree.

Degree Conferral

Degree conferral is the formal, official process of granting the degree.

Graduation

Graduation is a general, blanket term which describes the range of culminating events leading to a student's successful completion of an undergraduate or graduate program

Graduation, Degree Conferral, and Commencement are NOT interchangeable terms.

Teacher Certification Candidates

Each student pursuing teacher certification must complete the TEACH authorization form (submitted online), so we may provide required data to the New York State Education Department (NYSED).

After the student's degree has been conferred in our registered program, the Registrar's office will recommend the student to the New York State Education Department for the teaching certificate.
