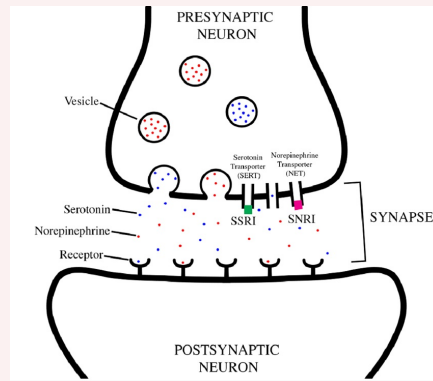

Atomoxetine

Attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD): The most common pediatric neuropsychiatric disorder causing inattention, hyperactivity and impulsivity

Serotonin & Norepinephrine Reuptake Inhibitor



A class of antidepressants that work by blocking the reuptake of the neurotransmitter norepinephrine and dopamine, thus increasing their levels in the brain

Rheumatoid Arthritis (RA): A chronic autoimmune disease that primarily affects joints, causing pain, swelling and stiffness

Osteoarthritis: Most common type of arthritis, characterized by the gradual breakdown of cartilage in joints (Common affected areas: spine, hands, hips or knees)

Osteoporosis: A skeletal disorder characterized by compromised bone strength predisposing a person to an increased risk of fracture (weakened bone)

Thyroid Disorders: Conditions that cause the thyroid to make either too much or too little of the hormones (hyperthyroidism and hypothyroidism). Masses may also appear on the thyroid and can alter the function of the thyroid (thyroid nodules).

Epilepsy: a neurological disorder characterized by predisposition to unprovoked seizures.

- Focal Seizures: Originate in one area of the brain
- Generalized Seizures: Originate from both sides of the brain

Parkinson Disease: A chronic neurodegenerative disease with progressive loss of dopaminergic neurons in the substantia nigra (a midbrain structure responsible for movement and reward).

Dyslipidemias: Metabolic abnormalities in the quantity (high or low) or function of lipids or lipoproteins in the blood. The majority of Dyslipidemias results from interaction between environmental and genetic factors.
