

### Panes key bindings

<b>v</b>	Split the current pane into two, left and right
<b>b</b>	Split the current pane into two, top and bottom
<b>q</b>	Briefly display pane indexes
<b>o</b>	Select the next pane in the current window
<b>h</b>	Select the left pane in the current window
<b>j</b>	Select the bottom pane in the current window
<b>k</b>	Select the top pane in the current window
<b>l</b>	Select the right pane in the current window
<b>;</b>	Move to the previously active pane
<b>!</b>	Break the current pane out of the window
<b>x</b>	Kill the current pane
<b>z</b>	Zen mode pane

A window occupies the entire screen and may be split into rectangular panes, each of which is a separate pseudo terminal.

### DESCRIPTION

**Tmux** — is a opensource terminal multiplexer

tmux may be controlled from an attached client by using a key combination of a prefix key, 'C-a' (Ctrl-a).

### Windows key bindings

<b>c</b>	Create a new window
<b>&amp;</b>	Kill the current window
<b>w</b>	Choose the current window interactively
<b>1...9</b>	Select windows 0 to 9
<b>p</b>	Change to the previous window
<b>n</b>	Change to the next window
<b>f</b>	Prompt to search for text in open windows
<b>'</b>	Prompt for a window index to select

Each session has one or more windows linked to it.

### Session key bindings

<b>\$</b>	Rename the current session
<b>s</b>	Select a new session for the attached client interactively
<b>L</b>	Switch the attached client back to the last session

A session is a single collection of pseudo terminals.

### Start tmux

To start a session

```
tmux
```

To reattach a previous session

```
tmux attach
```
