Usages:

Works just like: "~とは" Emphasizes word before なんて。Surprise / Unexpectation.

xpress your feelings such as surprise (positive/negative), disgust, admiration, happiness, disbelief, etc. Used for disbelief or deep emotion about unexpected facts, seen, or heard. This expression is used in spoken language,

【軽蔑】 keibetsu : Despise 【軽視】 keishi : Disrespect 【謙遜】 kenson : When you look down, belittle someone or something, lack confidence or when you are being

humble.

Sometimes \mathcal{E} is added in front of \mathcal{L} to add emphasis
