DONT's: Making an assumption by looking at something	For negation, it completely changes	-If this is used with another person, the meaning remains the same as "It looked like he/she"
-Cannot be used to compliment someone's appearance	ひろきはがっこうにこなさそうです。 It seems like Hiroki won't come to school.	食べちゃいそうだった。 I almost ate it.
メガネをかけている人はあたまがよさそうです。 People who wear glasses look / seem smart.		死にそうだった。 I almost died.
コーヒーはなくなりそうです。 We are about to run out of coffee.
