

What is Civics?

Civics is the study of the duties and rights of citizens.

What's the difference between a duty and a right?

Duties	Rights
Ex: Taxes, obey laws, school, defend the nation, jury	Ex: Freedom of speech, freedom of religion, voting

What is government?

Government is the ruling authority for a community.

What is citizenship?

Citizenship is the rights and duties of citizens.

- Dates back to more than 2,500 years to ancient Greece and Rome
 - **Natural-born citizens** are any person born in the United States
 - **Naturalized citizens** can become a citizen using a legal process - **MUST** be able to read, write, and understand English.
 - **Citizen** is a member of a community who owes their loyalty to a government and in turn are entitled to protection from the government.
- (Example: Students sue Rhode Island over lack of Civics education).
