I Template Composition

Follow the templates above with a **Type** shortcut (selected from the lists below and in the two columns to the right). For example, on an empty line inside a class or method, "**nb**" followed by your template expand key (typically either the spacebar or Tab key) creates a New initialized Boolean instance. "**m**" by itself creates a method with no return value (a Sub in VB). "**ms**" will create a Method that returns a String.
