

What this cheat sheet is about

In this easy-to-read cheat sheet you are going to find some (and the list will be updated...) of the most used IRREGULAR past participles in the Italian language.

The purpose is to provide a quick reference, hoping that the ease of consultation will also help retain in the memory the "apparently senseless" exceptions in the construction of the past participles.

The different chart also indicates whether the specific verb is going to have *AVERE* or *ESSERE* in the *passato prossimo*. Also in this case I hope that this quick reference will help your memory.
