#### What is schizophrenia?

>Psychotic disorder that affects 1% (approx.) of the population>Sufferers cannot distinguish between reality and their perceptions

| >e.g. delusions<br>(unrealistic<br>thoughts - often of<br>threats)                   | >e.g. broadcasting<br>(believing your<br>thoughts are being<br>broadcast to people) |
| >e.g. psychomotor<br>disturbances<br>(repetitive behavi-<br>ours)                    | >e.g. avolition<br>(distinct lack of<br>motivation)                                 |
| >e.g. catatonia<br>(same position for<br>hours/days)                                 | >e.g. thought<br>disorders (loose<br>associations)                                  |

| >using DSM (Diagnostic and Statistical<br>Manual) or ICD (International Classification<br>of Disease)   |
| >ICD has types of schizophrenia, DSM<br>does not  |
| >DSM at least one positive symptom to be<br>diagnosed, ICD only two negative<br>symptoms  |
| Reliability   |
| >different clinicians using the same system should come to the same diagnosis   |
| > <i>Jakobson et al (2005)</i> tested ICD-10<br>reliability 100 Danish patients with history of<br>psychosis assesses ~ 98% concordance<br>rate |
| >comorbidity patients can suffer from two or<br>more mental disorders makes it hard to<br>confidently identify schizophrenia                    |
| >symptom overlap e.g. major depression and schizophrenia both have low motivation   |
| reduces reliability   |
| >gender bias ~ <i>Loring and Pwell (1988)</i><br>found some behaviour was regarded<br>psychotic in males but not in females                     |
