What's `__init__.py`?

Placing an `__init__.py` in a directory marks the contents of the dir as a Python package

For example,

```
somedir/__init__.py
```

```
somedir/mything.py
```

allows

```
import somedir.mything
```

dir containing somedir should be on your path

(`__init__.py` is usually empty, but you can use it to indicate more convenient importing options)

Difference bw `sorted(my_list)` and `my_list.sorted()`?

`sort()` is method of a list, sorts the list IN PLACE, does not return a list; `sorted()` is a built-in function, does not sort in place (so leaves original unchanged), returns a new list
