# Appropriateness vs Accuracy of language


# Appropriateness

Accuracy

Using appropriate language means that a speaker's language is suitable or fitting for themselves, as the speaker; our audience; the speaking context; and the speech itself.

Accuracy refers to how correct learners' use of the language system is, including their use of grammar, pronunciation and vocabulary.
