Ctrl + y	paste word or text that was cut using on of the deletion shortcuts (such as the or above) after the cursor
Ctrl + xx	move between start of command line ar current cursor position (and back again)
Alt + b	move backward one word (or go to start of word the cursor is currently on)
Alt + f	move forward one word (or go to end of word the cursor is currently on)
Alt + d	delete to end of word starting at cursor (whole word if cursor is at the beginning of word)

Bash E	Bang (!) Commands
!!	run last command
!blah	run the most recent command that starts with 'blah' (e.g. !ls)
!blah:p	print out the command that Iblah would run (also adds it as the latest command in the command history)
!\$	the last word of the previous command (same as Alt + .)
!\$:p	print out the word that !\$ would substitute
<u>!</u> *	the previous command except for the last word (e.g. if you type 'find some_file.txt /', then !* would give you 'find some_file.txt')
