Structure of Teeth

A tooth is divided up into three regions: crown, neck and root. These three regions combined illustrate different parts of anatomy.

Enamel

Dentine

Pulp Chamber

Cementum

Periodontium: *cementum, periodontal ligament, alveolar bone, and gingiva*

When identifying a tooth the tooth is broken up into four quadrants

Quadrant one: *top right - right maxillary permean*

Quadrant two: *top left - left maxillary permean*

Quadrant three: *bottom left - left mandible permean*

Quadrant four: *bottom right - right mandible permean*
