UNIVERSAL SELECTOR	Applies to all elements in document	*{} Targets all elements on page
TYPE SELECTOR	Matches elements names	h1 h2 {} Targets <h1> <h2> elements on page</h2></h1>
CLASS SELECTOR	Matches an element whose class attribute has value that matches the one specified after full stop	.class{} Targets any element whose class attribute has a value of class
ID SELECTOR	Matches an element whose id attribute has value that matches the one specified after hash sign	<pre>#intro {} Targets any element whose id attribute has a value of intro</pre>
CHILD SELECTOR	Matches an element that is a direct child of another	<pre>li > a {} Targets any <a> elements that are children of any element</pre>
DESCENDANT SELECTOR	Matches an element that is a descendant of another specified element	<pre>p a {} Targets any <a> elements that sit inside any element</pre>
ADJACENT SIBLING SELECTOR	Matches an element that is next sibling of another	<pre>h1 + p {} Targets first element after any <h1> element</h1></pre>
GENERAL SIBLING SELECTOR	Matches an element that is a sibling of another, although it does not have to be the direclty preceding element	<pre>h1 ~ p {} if you had two elements that are siblings of an element, this rule would apply to both</pre>
