Personal Care Defined

Personal care is defined by bathing, oral care, and grooming.

Institutionalization: People are creatures of habit, sometimes we may become too comfortable with receiving care that we lose our independence. It is important to encourage patients to provide self-care for themselves when they are able to.

Why is Hygiene Important?

- **1. Safety:** You are killing pathogens which may cause disease. Skin is particularly important to clean due to skin breakdown.
- 2. Comfort & Well-being: People find dignity through not only being presented as properly groomed, but their self perception is positively influenced by being clean.

How Nurses Provide Personal Care

DIPPS: Dignity, Independence, Privacy, Preference, Safety

Knowledge: Cultural Practices, Therapeutic Communication, A&P (Clean to Dirty), Pathology, Nursing Process, Standard Precautions, Products Used

Skills: Assessment, Standard Precautions, Organization, Body Mechanics, Client Teaching, Documentation

Judgement: Client's Self-care Abilities, Appropriate Product Use, Bathing Techniques, Room Environment

Attitude: Care, Respect, Empathy, Confidence, Flexibility, Non-Judgmental

Skin	Acne, Rash, Dermatitis, Dryness, Open Areas, Discharge	
Hair	Dandruff, Alopecia, Scalp	
Nose	Oxygen, Dryness, Discharge	
Ears	Excessive Wax Build-up, Hearing	
Nails	Ingrown Nails, Fungal Nails	
Feet	Calluses, Warts, Fungal Infections

Oral Care	Dressing		
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- ♦ Shower: Not recommended for certain patients, hard to breathe
- ♦ Over Toilet: Be mindful of care provided over the toilet, it can be demeaning.

◆ Patients will usually have their own basins or personal wipes for infection control.		

Bed Bath

Preparation: Privacy, Turn Heat Up, Warm Water

Order to Wash: Eyes, Face & Neck, Arms, Chest, Legs, Back, Perineum

- Wash clean to dirty to prevent infection spread from dirty areas to clean areas.
- ◆ Take extra care to dry folds to prevent skin breakdown.

Oral Care	
Assessment	Needs & Abilities prior to assistance, General Appearance, Odors, Pain, Mouth Structures,
Examine	Lips, Mucuous Membrances, Gums, Tongue, Teeth, Odor, Dentures,
Types	Brushing Teeth & Gums, Flossing, Denture Care

- ♦ Oral care is provided BID (AM & PM) under normal circumstances.
- ♦ Before or after meals
- ◆ Q2H when client is: unconscious, unable to eat by mouth(NPO)
- ♦ Never put your fingers into an unconscious client's mouth, they may bite due to reflex.
